On the trek from Jerusalem to Emmaus, Jesus will harmonize to two of His followers the conflict of the suffering Messiah with the Glorified Messiah. This was a doctrine missed by most Jews at the time.

Research and look for possible Old Testament passages Jesus may have highlighted on that walk. Remember, in these passages He taught them “the things concerning himself.” The Old Testament reveals to us Jesus and why He came!

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John Wycliffe, the 14th century theologian and Biblical translator, said of Jesus' Old Testament teaching along the Emmaus road, "Our Lord's exposition of these passages has not been preserved as a discourse, but probably his explanations formed the basis of apostolic interpretations of the Old Testament in sermons in Acts and in the Epistles."

Read Christ Appears to the Disciples – Thomas Absent found in Mark 16:14; Luke 24:36-43; John 20:19-25.

1. Check the facts:

- A. Why did Jesus scolded the disciples when He first appeared to them?
- B. How many times did Jesus say, “Peace be unto you.” Why do you think He did this?
- C. What was the emotion of the disciples when Jesus appeared? Why do you think they reacted this way?
- D. What two evidence did Jesus use to prove He was risen in the flesh? Give Scriptures. Did this change their emotion?
- E. What is recorded that Jesus said and did after He had convinced them He was physically risen from the dead? Give at least 4 comments or actions.

2. The disciples’ hearts and minds were full of fear, unbelief, worry, sadness, and confusion. What had they forgotten? Give a several sentences concerning how we can also find ourselves much like the disciples. Support your thoughts with Scripture.
